The Table (Love Feast)

Luke 22:7-23 Acts 2:1-4

Preparation

- 1. Watch the sermon from your church YouTube channel
- 2. Begin with a time of prayer asking God to help you learn something new
- 3. Read the passages below and reflect on the questions, if meeting with a group share your answers together.

Reading:

Luke 22:7-23

The Last Supper

⁷Then came the day of Unleavened Bread on which the Passover lamb had to be sacrificed. ⁸ Jesus sent Peter and John, saying, 'Go and make preparations for us to eat the Passover.' ⁹ 'Where do you want us to prepare for it?' they asked. ¹⁰ He replied, 'As you enter the city, a man carrying a jar of water will meet you. Follow him to the house that he enters, ¹¹ and say to the owner of the house, "The Teacher asks: where is the guest room, where I may eat the Passover with my disciples?" ¹² He will show you a large room upstairs, all furnished. Make preparations there.' ¹³ They left and found things just as Jesus had told them. So they prepared the Passover.

¹⁴ When the hour came, Jesus and his apostles reclined at the table. ¹⁵ And he said to them, 'I have eagerly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer. ¹⁶ For I tell you, I will not eat it again until it finds fulfilment in the kingdom of God.' ¹⁷ After taking the cup, he gave thanks and said, 'Take this and divide it among you. ¹⁸ For I tell you I will not drink again from the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes.' ¹⁹ And he took bread, gave thanks and broke it, and gave it to them, saying, 'This is my body given for you; do this in remembrance of me.'

²⁰ In the same way, after the supper he took the cup, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which is poured out for you. [a] ²¹ But the hand of him who is going to betray me is with mine on the table. ²² The Son of Man will go as it has been decreed. But woe to that man who betrays him!' ²³ They began to question among themselves which of them it might be who would do this.

Acts 2:1-4

The Holy Spirit comes at Pentecost

2 When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. ² Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. ³ They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. ⁴ All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues^[a] as the Spirit enabled them.

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Questions for discussion

Reflect on the message of the sermon using the following questions. Take time at the end to ask what is God teaching you this week to help you grow as a disciple of Jesus?

1.	What is one thing that stood out to you from this week's message?
2.	Jesus stated that he was eager to eat the Passover meal with the disciples before he suffered. Why?
3.	How does Judas' betrayal of Jesus challenge your understanding of loyalty and trust
4.	What does the Lord's supper encourage us to look back on, look within for, and look forward to?

- 5. How should the events of this chapter affect our communion practices today?
- 6. What shadow or impact does the Lords supper cast on your life?
